Cancer Forecast: 100 % chance of expensive medical bills ... and neighbors who care

For too many in our community, cancer threatens more than the patient's health. Many struggle with impossible financial choices as the high cost of treatment devestates the family's income and wittles away their life savings. Low income families facing cancer in northeast Georgia turn to The Cancer Foundation, Inc. Requests for support are **up 28 percent** over last year as inflation in housing, food, power and fuel costs continue to rise.

Our donors and sponsors continue to amaze us with their steadfast support allowing TCF to intervene in the lives of those hit the hardest by the storms of life that cancer brings. TCF offers patients some much-needed good news:

- "Your rent has been paid for this month."
- "A gas card is on its way so you can get to treatment."

At a time when hope is in short supply, patients are relieved to know their family is protected by the generosity of others. Do you get anxious going to the mailbox?



- The family has provided proof of low income/financial hardship. On average TCF families have annual household income less than \$18,000.





Below is an excerpt from a letter from Mr. Jim Wallace outlining his motivation for giving to The Cancer Foundation. His dedication to the needs of others continues to guide the efforts of The Cancer Foundation Board, Volunteers, and Staff.

Up until August 2014, I was working hard, and I had just about beat prostate cancer. I felt as if I was on top of the world, trying to live life with the utmost joy. I felt as if I had come into my prime and I quickly realized the harder I worked, the more joy I received.

After seeing eleven doctors for help with my throat problems, I asked for a biopsy. A few days later, the results came back; I had tested positive for tongue and throat cancer. My emotions went from extreme joy to complete sorrow and hopelessness. After getting over the initial shock and beginning my treatments; I noticed I was really depressed. I remember asking "why me?" and felt a lot of pity for myself.

Then I remembered how I had beat prostate cancer twice. It had been a long journey and a hard fight, but it was well worth it. I made up my mind that I was going to kick cancer again and regain my life. While going through this experience, I noticed how I could help the other patients that are fighting cancer. I know many people aren't as blessed as I have been, so I am so thankful I can offer support to make their lives a little easier while facing their illness. I realized that this is what makes life worthwhile....giving back.
